Health Priority: Access to Health Services

GOAL: Increase access to health care, dental care, and behavioral care for residents of Scott County experiencing barriers to care

Why It's Important

Access to comprehensive, quality health care services is a cornerstone of public health. It not only allows for the treatment and management of illness or disease, but is also important for promoting and maintaining health and reducing unnecessary disability and premature death. Because of this, lack of access to quality health care is a key driver of health inequity.²³

This priority area is focused on the ease with which individuals can obtain medical, dental, or mental health care that is convenient, appropriate, and affordable. There are significant subgroups in the Scott County population for whom it is harder to access care than others. These include low-income families with or without health insurance, elderly residents, those without reliable transportation, residents living in rural and agricultural areas, and immigrants who face language and cultural barriers with the health system.





Scott County Public Health Clinics



Scott County Public Health offers several clinics for Scott County residents who are uninsured or under-insured



The Health Matters Clinic provides free medical care for short term illness, ongoing health problems, and health screenings. Clinic services are free for all uninsured children and adults.



The Immunization Clinic provides immunizations to Scott County residents age 6 weeks through adulthood. The clinic is generally open two Monday's per month from 2:00–5:00 pm. A \$10 donation per vaccine is appreciated, but not required.



The Nurse Clinic offers care for residents who need help with health issues including immunizations, blood pressure checks, glucose monitoring, and general health questions. The clinic also provides Tuberculosis skin tests (Mantoux), which are given on Tuesday and read on Thursday. There is a \$30 fee for the Mantoux testing. The clinic is open Tuesday and Thursday mornings 8:30-10:30 am.

What is the mission of a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)?



The Mission of the Bureau of Primary Care is to **increase access to comprehensive primary and preventative health care and to improve the healthcare status of underserved and vulnerable populations.** The BPHC's Health Center Program is an essential element in support of the mission of OPDHC.-

What is a FQHC?

- Section 330 of the Public Health Service Act (1944) defines federal grant funding opportunities for organizations that meet certain criteria:
 - Located in or serve a MUA/MUP/HPSA
 - Governed by community board
 - Provides comprehensive primary health care
 - Service available to all with adjusted fees
 - Other grant specific performance and accountability requirements

What is a MUA/MUP/HPSA?

Medically Underserved Areas (MUAs) may be a whole county or a group of contiguous counties, a group of county or civil divisions or a group of urban census tracts in which residents have a shortage of personal health services.

Medically Underserved Populations (MUPs) may include groups of persons who face economic, cultural or linguistic barriers to health care.

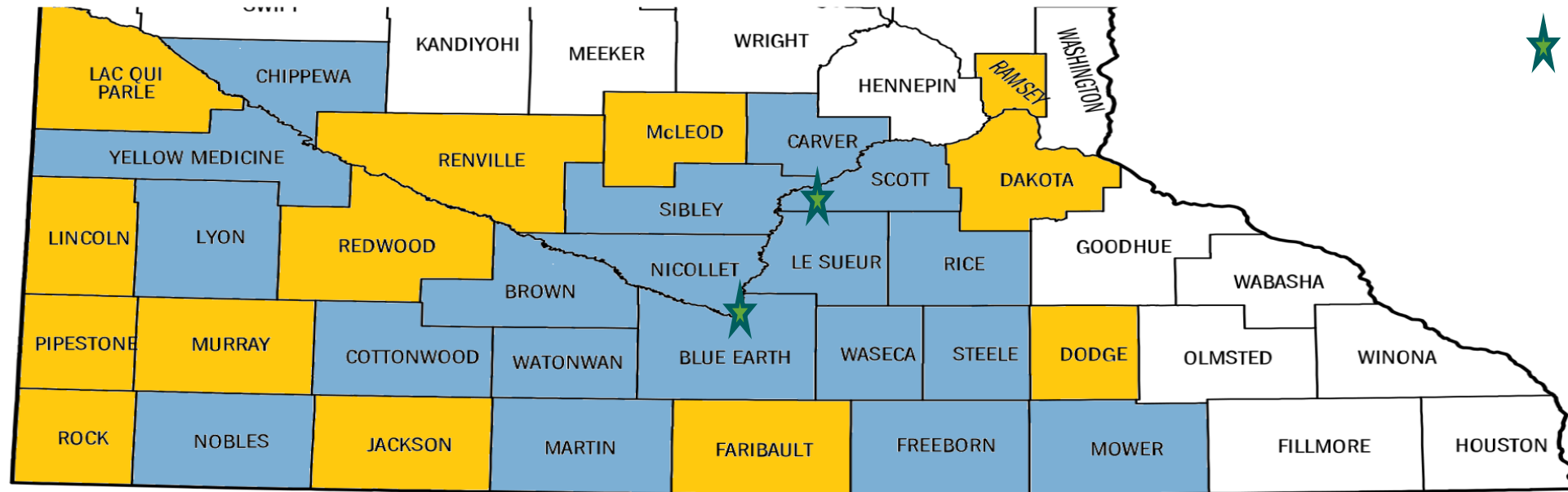
Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) designations are based on general HPSA designation criteria, plus additional criteria and guidelines specific to each of the three types of designations:

*Lowering blood sugar & blood pressure for improved health:
A grant partnership with Scott County Public Health*

What is Bringing Down the Numbers?

- A grant-funded pilot program to manage chronic disease through the utilization of frontline healthcare workers in the Latinx community in Scott County.
- The goal is to help participants improve key metrics associated with their conditions (A1C, Blood Glucose and Blood Pressure) and assist them with underlying social issues that also affect their health and family's well-being



What is Bringing Down the Numbers?

The primary aims of the program:

1. Improved Latinx community member health & wellness
2. Improved population health among Latinx in Scott County
3. Reduced healthcare costs across the diabetes and hypertension health continuum.



What is Bringing Down the Numbers?

- The pilot includes:
 - In-person or virtual home-visits from a community paramedic (CP), in partnership with a community health/public health worker (CHW)
 - Help with assessment, clinical needs for specific conditions (Diabetes, Hypertension)
 - Health & Wellness coaching and education
 - Navigating support for other wellness and social needs for up to 25 families over a 6-9 month period.
 - CPs and CHWs will take a familial approach as they educate and coach on how to manage their condition.

VEGGIE RX



VEGGIE RX

"Veggie Rx" is a produce prescription program, meaning your healthcare provider will "prescribe" you fresh vegetables and fruits. This program is free to eligible River Valley Health Services, Scott County Health Matters, and Scott County Family Home Visiting patients.

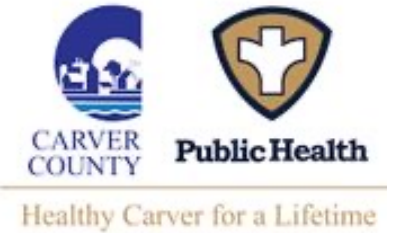
How does Veggie Rx Work?

Your healthcare provider will screen you for the Veggie Rx program. Eligible participants must enroll in the program. Each week for 16 weeks you will pick up a free bag of produce. It is strongly encouraged to pick up your bag each week.

What's in the Bag?

Each week the Veggie Rx bag will include about 5-8 varieties of locally grown produce such as greens, garlic, onions, squash, herbs, tomatoes, corn, peppers, beans, carrots, and apples. The variety will depend on what's in season and is picked at peak freshness. Most of the vegetables are grown nearby at the Minnesota Landscape Arboretum by local farmers.
